Prepare for a hassle-free delivery with this 8-point checklist



☐ **Make sure the truck can turn**

The truck needs at least a width of 4 metres to easily access your location. Make sure that there are no fences or other obstacles blocking the truck's path.

☐ **Make sure the ground is firm**

The ground must be firm and hard, not made of sand or loose dirt, and provide a stable surface for the loaded truck to drive on.

☐ **Check the weather conditions**

Weather conditions, such as rain or snow, can impact delivery, so make sure the road and container location are dry and firm.

☐ **Make sure the delivery site is flat**

Avoid hills or slopes. We use tilt beds to deliver your container, therefore placing a container on an incline is impossible.

☐ **Make sure the container is level**

To ensure doors work properly it is essential that the container is placed on an even & level surface.

☐ **Watch out for overhead obstacles**

Make sure that there are no obstructions, such as power lines or tree branches, within 5 metres above the delivery area.

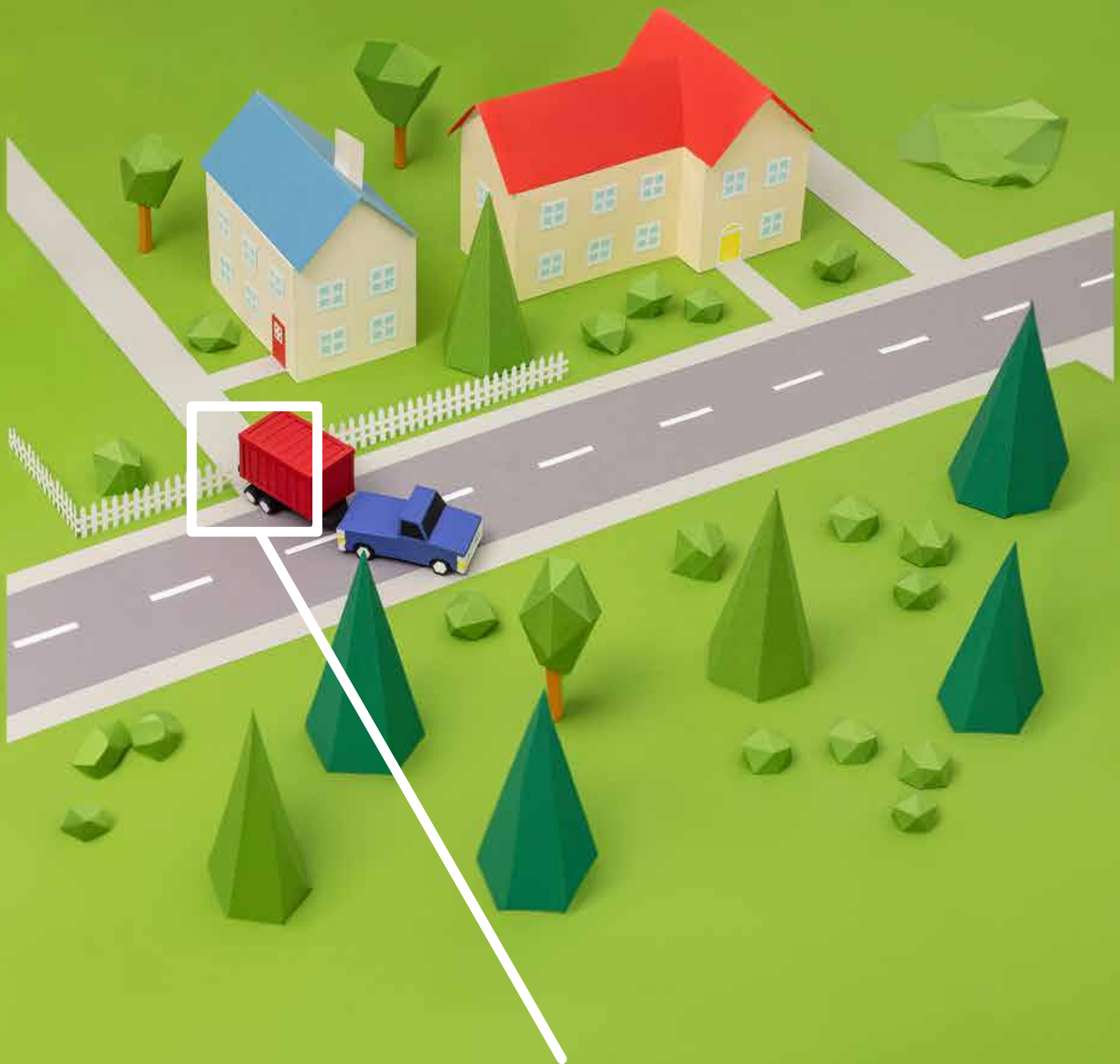
☐ **Make sure there is enough space**

Make sure there is enough space in front of the container, equal to 3x the length of your container (\pm 18 meters for a 20 ft and 37 meters for a 40 ft container).

☐ **Make sure the area is clear**

Make sure you have a length of 18 metres for a 20 ft container and a length of 37 metres for a 40 ft container available. For both sizes, you'll need a width of 2.5 metres that is free of any obstructions.

Firm delivery surface



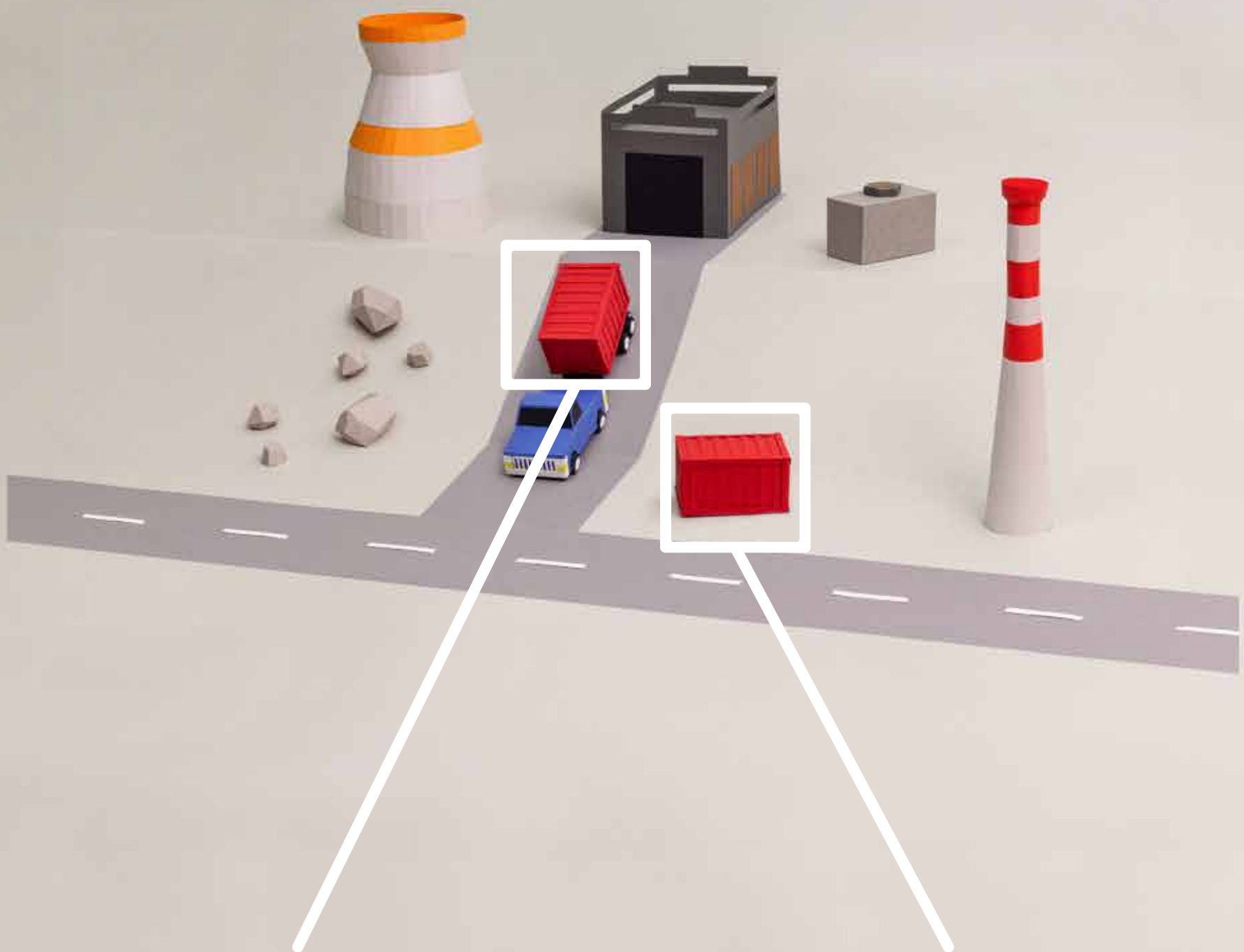
Make sure the ground is firm
